Course Description

Welcome to PACE (Program in Advanced Curricular Exploration) English 9! 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Late Work

This may be in the form of reading, researching, writing essays, preparing for in-class discussions, or reviewing for a test. Typically, traditional homework will not be assigned. Cases for late work and extensions will be handled as follows:

- Absent
 - If you anticipate or know you will be absent, notify Mr. Wong before the absence in-person or digitally. You will have as many days as you were absent to make up the assignment.
- Not Absent
 - If you turn in work late and were not absent, you must have a conversation with Mr. Wong on why the work is late. Accommodations and penalties will be handled on a case-by-case basis.
- Anticipated need for extensions
 - If you anticipate you will be unable to meet a deadline, you can notify Mr. Wong before the deadline. Whether and what accommodations will be granted will be handled on a case-by-case basis.
